Annual Report 2018-19

Diya Academy of Learning is an initiative by August Foundation, a non-profit organization aimed to enhance the quality of education and bring values as a part of it. School has classes from pre-primary to grade 10. In pre-primary, a mixed approach of kindergarten and Montessori style is used. From grade 1 onwards we follow CBSE board curriculum. Campus is of 5 acres with two buildings and different playgrounds. Infrastructure is designed to cater to cater to the holistic approach taken for the development of students.

Many schools had participated in the event in which the participants had to code, assemble and design their own robots. Our students bagged the third place in the competition.

Neha Nair of grade 7 and Pranesh of grade 8 qualified to participate in the State Level Camp.

Academics

We adopt a holistic approach in imparting knowledge to our students. The whole plan revolves around four pillars of education

- Learning to know
- Learning to live together
- Learning to do
- Learning to be

Activities play an important role in learning concepts, so every subject includes enrichment activities that initiate interest in students. Learning by doing has been an integral part of our academics. As a part of it we are continuing with our “Young Engineers Programme” for grades 3-10 where students use their creativity and knowledge to build machines and robots under the guidance of the teachers.

Many subject wise activities were arranged throughout the year to make learning fun for the students. Many classes were conducted outside the four walls of the classrooms. Teachers used creative ways to teach different lessons.

Weekly meetings of teachers with subject experts helped them to plan in ahead and monitor the progress of children in terms of learning outcomes. Grade wise meetings were also held in particular to discuss about each child in those classes. These meetings were the key for teachers to understand, guide and follow different teaching practices.

Examination department is functional under the guidance of all subject experts which makes sure the quality of question papers meets the true objective of conducting exams. Remedial classes were conducted throughout the year for those students who needed extra help.

Celebrations

We celebrate all festivals in our school campus so that our students learn to respect every religion and its culture. Many theme based celebrations are conducted throughout the year like Friendship Day, Environment Day, father's Day, Language Day, Teacher's Day and Children's Day.

Competitions

Many individual and house wise competitions were held to create healthy competitive environment amongst them. They provided a platform to the students to display their talents and skills, to work as a team with cooperation and collaboration. We believe in improving the social skills of our children which will help them in becoming responsible citizens of the country when they grow up. A few competitions are cited below:

Student Council Elections

The members of the Student Council were elected through a democratic election process. The whole procedure to conduct an election was followed where teachers acted as election officers and the nomination procedures were followed under their guidance. Google forms were made in place of ballot papers to maintain the secrecy as well as to enable quick announcement of results. Students from grades 3-10 were guided to cast their votes in the staff room which was set up like a "polling booth". An ink mark was given to their left index finger as proof of casting their votes to make it more authentic. Results were announced the very next day and the council members were handed over the responsibilities during an investiture ceremony.

Annual Sports Day

Annual Sports Day was held on 26th January, 2019. Both Montessori, Primary and Secondary school students participated in the event. Many individual and house-wise competitions were held. The Montessori section presented a host of splendid field displays in which all the students participated. The REST Olympia was kicked off by a spectacular March Past by the four houses. It was followed by colourful and perfectly synchronised drills by different classes. The finals of races were held. Some games were also organized for the parents in which many of them participated enthusiastically. It was a day filled with sportsmanship, enthusiasm and memories to cherish.

Life Skill Activities

Life Skills are abilities and behaviours that help everyone to effectively deal with the events and challenges of everyday life. They help us to accomplish our ambitions and live life to our full potential.

Diya believes in preparing students for life rather than only imparting bookish knowledge. Life skills are required by everyone on a day to day basis to face different types of situations and emotions. Different life skill activities were arranged throughout the year to help the students to know themselves better and acquire different skills.

Newspaper in Education

Newspaper and news can play an important role in the development of education. It supplements the overall learning. Times Newspaper in Education is a novel program that helps students 'Stay ahead' and at making 'Learning fun.' Students from grade 4-10 receive the Times News Paper in Education (NIE) on a daily basis. Reports of all the major events of the school are sent to the newspaper. NIE is used extensively in all the classrooms to improve the general knowledge and communication skills of the students.

Career Guidance and Counselling

Career guidance acts as a stepping stone for success. It is essential for good quality career development. We started the Career guidance and Counselling sessions for the students of grade 6-10 to guide them in choosing a good career for themselves. A number of Guest Lectures addressed our students on different types of careers.

Educational Trips

Educational trips always broaden the educational experience and make a subject more relevant. This was the main objective of taking students for various field trips and outstation trips. Students of grade 7-10 were taken to Doordarshan Kendra where they learned about the various technicalities of television production. Grade 3-6 went to Nehru Planetarium and Indira Gandhi Park. Grade 1 and 2 were taken to MG Active Farm.

As a part of outstation trip grade 6-10 was taken to Hyderabad, a city known for its cultural excellence.

Teacher Trainings

It is important to understand that teaching is an evolving skill because a good teacher like a good student keeps on learning within the framework of information. Teaching and learning go hand in hand. Continuous training is necessary for teachers to equip themselves and cater seamlessly to the 21st Century learner. Based on the need of the hour Diya teachers attended a few workshop the list of which is as follows:-

Teachers spent a considerable amount of time with the parents to discuss different issues regarding academics and behaviour.

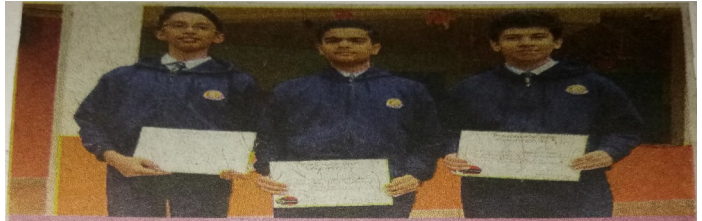

The school playground was soaked in team spirit as different team members participated in the track events and displayed their sportsmanship. The winners were awarded with medals and certificates.

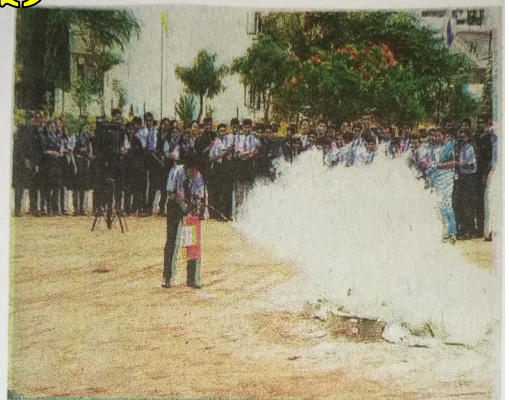
Sapphire House bagged the trophy for best march past. Topaz House were declared overall champions.

Restaurant Etiquette – How To Create A Favourable Impression When Eating Out

“Good manners will open doors that the best education cannot.”


Etiquette is the science of living. It embraces everything. People all over the world are judged: liked, disliked, remembered or looked down with contempt based on their manners. Good manners speak a lot about your personality.

It is imperative that you display your best

behaviour when you are in a public place especially when eating out. When you walk into a restaurant you don't want to look like a snob, right?

Here are a few things that will help you make an impression at a restaurant.

1. **Dress appropriately:** You are what you wear. Everyone knows that the way you dress makes an impact on people. So let your wardrobe make the first impression for you. When you dress up, you will feel more confident and 'the feel good factor' will bring out the best in you.



2. Raise your hand: When you want to grab the attention of a server, raise your hand. This is the most simple and basic thing. Avoid shouting or waving at him, which would make you look rude.

3. Be polite: It would be good if you could remember the server's name and address him by his name. Make use of the magic words- Thank You and Please. For you they might sound simple, but for them it's a huge boost to their morale.

4. Help with menu: You can ask any pertinent question relating to the food that you wish to order. For example, questions like what the entrée consists of, whether the quantity is sufficient enough to be shared, how a particular dish is prepared (not the whole recipe, of course!), etc. Inform him of any food allergies that you may have so as to avoid embarrassing situation.

5. Ordering: Once you have made up your mind, keep your menu card down and wait for the server, in case he has moved to attend to other customers. Once ready with your order, don't make him stand and wait, while you start deliberating on the menu again. Order right away! Make eye contact with him while ordering.

6. Be patient to wait: Remember that you are not the only food connoisseur sitting at the table ready to pounce on the prey. Give sufficient time to the server and be willing to wait for your order, if the restaurant is crowded.

7. Forgive if something goes wrong: Your server is also a human being and we all make mistakes. Hence if there is any lapse on his or the chef's part, be willing to forgive. Don't take the opportunity to show your superiority. If you yell and scream and bring the roof down, you will be cutting a sorry figure in front of the others. So, pipe down!

8. Keep your belongings to yourself: Do not keep your mobile phone, keys, wallet and other things on the table. It's a big distraction for you and for the others.

9. Leave the space for others: Once you have finished eating, do not monopolise the place but leave the table within 10-15 minutes so that it can be utilised for the next customer.

Other simple things to keep in mind are:

1. Keep the napkin on your lap.
2. Focus on your food.
3. Do not waste food.
4. Do not speak with food in your mouth.
5. Do not brush your hair when you are at the table.
6. Do not use toothpicks at the table.
